

From 787, take Exit 8 and follow signs to downtown Troy over the Green Island Bridge. At the end of the bridge, turn right, and turn right again at the next light (River Street). The Arts Center is approximately one block down on the right.

During the daytime, there is free on-street parking available for two hour increments. This parking is limited, and we recommend that you allow additional time to find a space.

During evening hours, street parking is plentiful and free of charge, and public parking facilities remain open.

The class will culminate with demonstrations of a variety of recipes for the food allergic of any of the Top 8 Allergens (Wheat, Dairy, Soy, Tree Nuts, Peanuts, Sesame, Egg, Shellfish and Fish). Recipes will include a safe "non dairy/soy/ sesame" cheese sauce, 'non dairy & nut' pesto, safe granola, Faux Nuts Snack Treat, sunflower seed butter, and coconut milk yogurt. This class is intended to help families stay safe and creative in the kitchen, at the dining room table and out in the world where food is everywhere. The ground is then sprayed with an aquatint ground before etching. The white ground dissolves in the acid at varying rates depending on how thick the application of ground was. This is an introductory class on soap ground etching for students who have some etching experience.




