
The UNITING LINE



The goal of the Uniting Line public art project is

to transform and reactivate the area beneath the Hoosick Street Bridge between Troy's Downtown and North Central neighborhood. The project is part of a collaborative effort between the City of Troy, Arts Center of the Capital Region, TAP Inc., and Collar Works.

Troy is one of 16 cities nationwide selected for grant funding from Bloomberg Philanthropies' Asphalt Art Initiative.

About the Project

The Uniting Line will transform the space under the Hoosick Street Bridge – an urban void that acts as a massive divider between downtown Troy and North Central Troy – into a space that draws people together, uniting what a highway divided.

Through creative placemaking, the project will unify the area graphically, revitalize and beautify the area, encourage more pedestrian activity, and serve as a backdrop to activities that take place in these open spaces.

Earlier this year, based on community surveys, The Arts Center of the Capital Region released a call for proposals for The Uniting Line Underpass Mural project.

THE HOOSICK STREET BRIDGE ALLOWED ROUTE 7 TO BISECT THE CITY CARRYING RURAL AND SUBURBAN RESIDENTS TO ALBANY AND SCHENECTADY WITHOUT EXPERIENCE OF THE CITY. AND MAKING IT NEARLY IMPOSSIBLE FOR A PEDESTRIAN TO SAFELY PASS BETWEEN NEIGHBORHOODS.



Lead Artist Jade Warrick

- 16 submissions narrowed to 3 by an arts advisory group
- community members weighed in with their impressions of the 3 finalists
- Jade's work was selected after review of all feedback
- Jade opted to have the UL partnership manage the installation
- TAP Inc is managing the logistics
- Jade will be on site 8-10 hours per week, on a schedule she sets
- advises the Artistic Director and paints
- climbs ladders and rides in lifts
- attends training, understands and follows all safety procedures
- follows the directions of the superintendent

Artistic Director

- will be on site 30 to 40 hours per week
- experienced with public art installations
- experienced in large mural project
- understands the Artistic intent and speaks for Jade when she is not present
- resolves aesthetic questions and issue that arise on site
- works closely with superintendent setting schedule and making assignments
- climbs ladders and rides in lifts
- attends training, understands and follows all safety procedures

Superintendent

- will be on site 30 to 40 hours per week
- experienced with large art installations, and project management supervising crews of workers, experience in large mural projects is an advantage but not required
- understands the Artistic intent but defers to the Artistic Director in aesthetic issues
- works closely with Artistic Director setting crew schedules and making assignments
- Manages the base camp trailer and keeps it secure, opens and closes the site each day
- inventories all equipment and keeps it in usable condition
- coordinates the scheduling and use of rented equipment with TAP Inc. (lifts, ladders, pressure washers, etc.)
- Verifies all time sheets and reports crew hours to ACCR staff
- climbs ladders and rides in lifts
- Organizes crew orientations and trainings
- understands and follows all safety procedures
- Answers questions for people and distributes info

Skilled Mural Artists

- will be on site 20 to 40 hours per week, schedules will be tailored to accommodate crews
- experience with large art installations, and/or mural projects is an advantage
- artistic portfolio is required, submit a list of projects and work samples to demonstrate your skill level.
- follows the Artistic Director's instructions in aesthetic issues
- agrees to and follows the Superintendent's schedules and assignments
- supervises an apprentice, taking responsibility for the apprentice's work
- endeavors to keep the site clean and cares for equipment they are assigned
- submits time sheets to the Superintendent
- climbs ladders and rides in lifts
- participates in orientations and trainings
- understands and follows all safety procedures
- refers public questions to the Superintendent

Mural Art Apprentices

- will be on site 20 to 40 hours per week, schedules will be tailored to accommodate crews
- experience with art installations, and/or mural projects is an advantage but not required
- 16 years or older with one reference from a community member, art teacher, etc.
- Works closely with and follows directions from their assigned artist
- agrees to and follows the Superintendent's schedules and assignments
- endeavors to keep the site clean and cares for equipment they are assigned
- submits time sheets to the Superintendent
- · climbs ladders and rides in lifts
- participates in orientations and trainings
- understands and follows all safety procedures
- refers public questions to the Superintendent

Volunteers

- will work on designated volunteer days, some weekends
- no experience with art installations is required
- 14 years or older
- works closely with and follows directions Artistic Director and Superintendent
- agrees to and follows the Superintendent's schedules and assignments
- endeavors to keep the site clean and cares for equipment they are assigned
- climbs ladders, DOES NOT work in lifts
- participates in orientations and trainings
- understands and follows all safety procedures
- refers public questions to the Superintendent
